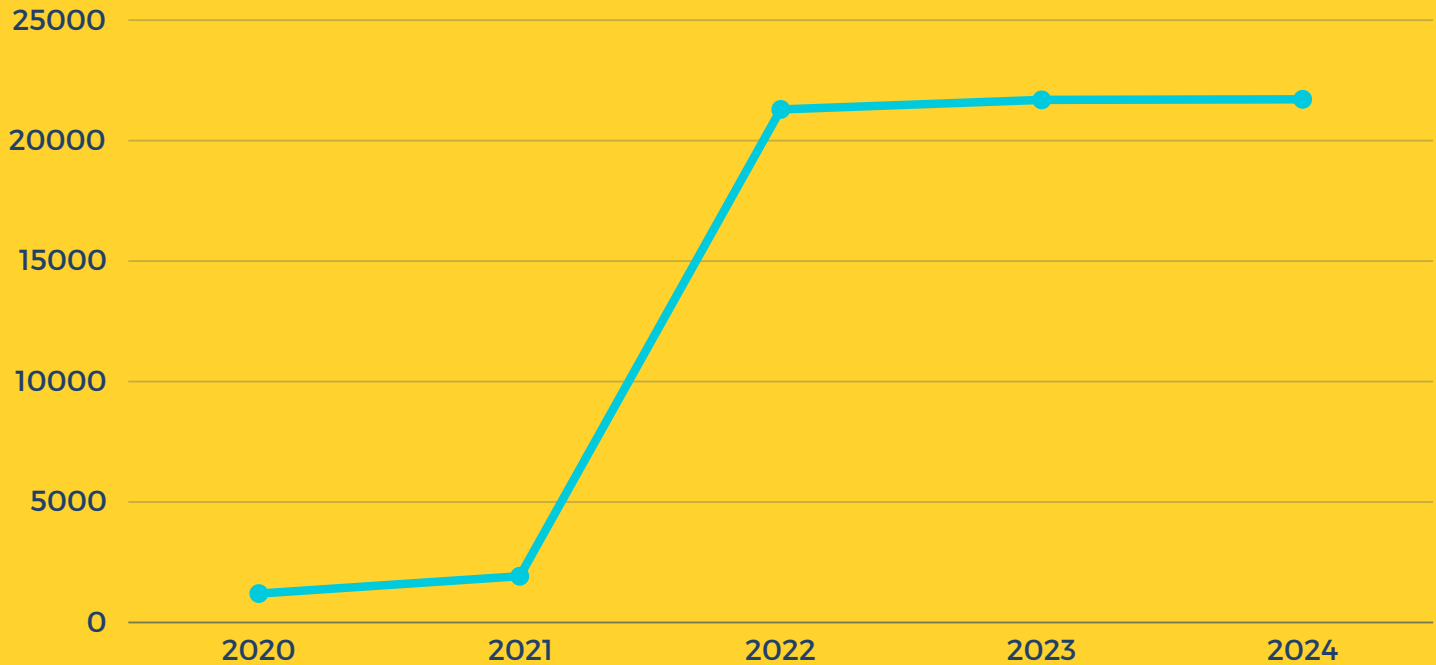

Our Growth



After February 2022, we shifted our focus from one-on-one support to large-scale emergency relief.

Thanks to the generosity of small-dollar donors, we shipped about 22,000 pounds of aid in 2022 and 2023. We are on track to match that number in 2024!

Our network of dedicated volunteers delivered aid to 17 regions of Ukraine, including occupied and newly-liberated territories.



Spotlight Stories



Kakhovka Dam

When the Kakhovka Dam was destroyed by Russian forces, entire villages flooded.

We partnered with the grassroots organization One Life Charitable Foundation, and our humanitarian aid was in Kherson the very next day.

Food, clean drinking water, clothing, medicine, and blankets were delivered to civilians left homeless by the floods.



Occupied Kherson



Civilians lack access to basic necessities in the occupied territories.

We shipped humanitarian aid to government-controlled Odesa, and our courageous volunteers transported it to occupied Kherson.

Civilians, who were living in basements for months, received clothing, non-perishable foods, and hygiene products,

We deliver essential humanitarian aid to dozens of individual children who lost their loved ones in the war. We are committed to being a steady presence in their lives and are honored to share in their journeys.

Pauline, Caroline, and Max (pictured below) lost both parents at a very young age. Sending them parcels since 2021, we've watched them grow and celebrate important milestones: first days of school, birthdays, and holidays. Recently, we sent Pauline a dress for her First Holy Communion. We can't wait to see her wear it!



Research

The Harvard Ukrainian Research Institute recently published a report by Executive Director Sofia Polishchuk on the experiences of Ukrainian displaced children.

The research documents the first-hand accounts of 63 Ukrainian children displaced by the war. It illustrates a heartbreaking picture of loss, endurance, adaptation, and hope.
